



On 2nd June 1987, Kayta Komisaruk was sentenced to five years in prison and a \$500,000 fine by a Los Angeles court. She was found guilty of damaging government property. Earlier that year, armed with a crowbar, hammer, drill and spray-paint and wire-cutters, she took out one third of the United States nuclear first strike capabilities by wrecking their NAVSTAR guidance computer.

Katya hitchhiked into the Vandenberg base, drilled holes into a satellite dish, painted slogans on the walls, and danced on the computer chips of the \$1,000,000 computer. She then left flowers and cookies for the soldiers, and hitched back to San Francisco. The following day she held a press conference and took responsibility for her actions, and was arrested by the FBI.

Katya had planned to use the principles of the Nuremberg Treaty as her defence, one of which states that a citizen has not only the right but the duty to interfere with

their government when it is preparing for a war of aggression, a crime against humanity. However, the judge ruled that there should be no discussion of her motives nor of the Nuremberg principles.


Katya's defence team are working for appeal based on the fact that Katya was denied her constitutional rights, in particular: the prosecution was allowed to introduce evidence that impugned Katya's motives which she was not allowed to rebuke.

Also the court ruled that Katya had the requisite 'specific intent' to violate the law

and therefore relieved the prosecution of its duty to prove guilt beyond reasonable doubt. It is hoped that there will be a decision concerning the appeal by the end of 1988.

Katya had called this action the White Rose Action after a group of students who resisted Hitler in Nazi Germany.

The other three women were bound over for 18 months—including one who incurred two £30 fines. 
some bits from a speech by Mildred Gordon in Parliament last June.

'Three quarters of rapists are known to their victims'

'In 1982 a 17 year old hitchhiker was told by a judge that she was guilty of contributory negligence, & the rapist, who was a business man, was not goal-ed but was fined £2000.'

One fifth of women in a 'Women against Rape' survey (85) had been raped or had suffered some sexual assault as a child or teenager. Some had told an adult, only to be told they were imagining things or that they should not talk dirty. Less than 1/3 of those who had been raped or sexually assaulted before they had reached the age of 11 had told anybody at the time of attack. Some had never told anybody before replying to the survey.


Non violent responses, why don't we tell our mums?



ONE 'NON VIOLENT' RESPONSE. WHICH SOUNDS GOOD WAS ORGANISED BY A WOMAN WHOSE SISTER HAD COMMITTED SUICIDE AFTER BEING RAPED. At the time a lot of men were getting away with rape in Dallas, Texas. The woman & friends formed 'The Preying Mantis' collective and got a list of convicted rapists (who'd all got sentences of just a few months & were out on the street again) from the police. They wanted to distribute the list in laundries etc and fly post Dallas. But they were worried tho' 'cos they knew the list would contain a disproportionate number of working class and black men because they're the ones most likely to get caught. After deliberation, they decided to take the risk & do the publicity anyway.


They got a really positive response from the women of Dallas and it seemed like a good political awareness thing. To us here at SP, it seems a better & more realistic strategy than castrating or beating the men up.

There's a nice quiet spot just near the rock garden. Oh yes, do you think you could follow us, just in case?




VIOLENCE BY WOMEN THE POLITICS OF HITTING BACK

The SP collective would like to make it clear that we do not all condone violence to men, even the castration, (chemical or otherwise) of rapists. In our news item 'NAIL-ED' we say that we're not sure this kind of violent revenge is the answer. After all, that's the way men run the world and we don't have to play their game. Some of us think life imprisonment with psychotherapy and disgusting food would be a better solution than torture.

On the other hand—we can understand why many women, including women who have suffered sexual abuse feel that castration may be the only answer. Rape IS torture. It is a horrific, psychologically debilitating crime which is perpetrated by men against women and children. It isn't about sex, it's about power. We think it won't stop until the power imbalance between women & men is righted. (one reason why at it's best castration is only a stop gap solution.)

However, we stand by our point that the mainstream media almost NEVER report stories showing women as other than victims. We think it's important to talk about hitting back. We are not helpless, we can fight. You don't have to go so far as castration, you could do graffiti on his car or house (THIS MAN IS A RAPIST) or on him. Or learn to hit bloody hard anyone who tries to attack you. It's your right—you don't have to be a victim.

Alright? I'm thinking about other things too so I'll send them when I've written them. L.

The rapist in the sitting room.

Violence says the government is on the up. Friends say so too. More women are sympathetic to SM. I also am getting more violent feelings—which horrify my 70's feminist sisters.

As an example. A rapist came to the square, the man in my house offered him to sleep in the sitting room. NO mention to me apart from the guy was quite overpowering. Found out via others that he might have raped someone. Asked flatmate:— 'Oh yes, a woman HAD said he had raped her' but flatmate 'likes to keep an open mind—helps communication'. Rapist moved out—was moving anyway.

Everyone really likes rapist & soon his rape is said to be a racist rumour not a fact. He remains around square. I'm angry (and scared). Told to cool down, forget about it. Options for me? leave, do nothing, unsupported do graffiti, try to find people who DO think rape is unacceptable. Actual violence doesn't cross my mind, but I'm called violent by even talking about the rape.

In my doom & gloom & powerlessness I laugh & enjoy the photostory of women castrating a rapist. Older women living in safe place, with safe jobs tell me its HORRIFIC to enjoy such an idea. Feminists are peaceful....

I agree—but in the midst of a community that condones rape & thers no growing women's movement about to save us all its hard not to fantasise about women hitting back.

Last June this woman in Lambeth got sexually abused. Her friends found out about it and nailed the guy who'd done it to a tree. Each one put one nail in. SP2 doesn't know exactly where they put the nails and doesn't know if such a violent reponse is THE answer but we do know that we never read about women hitting back in the national press. I reckon they WANT to promote the idea that men are capable of the most horrific violence against women and that women are totally incapable of retaliating. Just looking at the tabloids gets me shit scared. If potential rapists read over their cornflakes that they'd be grotesquely dismembered if the women got to them before the pigs did perhaps they might take up macrame instead of rape. Anyway, here at SP2 we're eager to print anyone's stories of mutilation against violent men so send them in please. (My mum's going to HATE that bit...)

Things I think— it's interesting that male doctors are so quick to whip out WOMEN'S female bits (eg in hysterectomies & mastectomies) and we accept this kind of medical violence to women almost without a murmur but mention castration of rapist & everyone (men & women) has a fit. What's so fucking special about testicles that doesn't matter about women's wombs? In some ways I almost think it's a valid punishment—castration—he's had his chance with 'masculinity' (I'm talking strength here, not 'urges'—don't believe in them) & he's abused it—go on then, serves him right. But 'til society stops giving men the idea that they can get away with rape & other sexual abuse, it's not really HIS crime only. So I don't know. I want... I want—I don't know what I want except no more women ever in the world ever again to be raped/abused. AND HOW THE FUCK DO YOU GET THAT?

News has just reached the Shocking Pink office of some spontaneous action which took place in Norwich! Hundreds of old people in the area who were angered by the recent rise in food prices in the local super-

market marched to the store and raided it. The shop assistants were overwhelmed by the numbers involved. Diane Williams who has worked in the store since last December told us 'It was amazing. I've never seen anything like it! We just had no way of stopping them. I've never seen so many old people in my life!' Mrs Hunter, 72, one of many who took part in the raid, explained, 'I have had enough. How does the Government expect us to survive on a meagre pension when the cost of food is so high. This is not the time to be a meek sheep when the cost of food will take place. We can assure you that alot more direct action will take place. We will not be arrested. P.C Alan Watkins commented 'It is a very bizarre situation. This is a lie but it made you happy, didn't it?'

Mass school boycott rocks Namibia

■ Whilst possible independence is being negotiated at a diplomatic level, inside Namibia South African colonialism has been shaken by probably the most far-reaching mass resistance in Namibian history. Based on a significant alliance between workers and students, the mass mobilisation has taken the form of a four month school boycott by an estimated 50,000 students and a national two day strike by one third of the country's industrial workforce.

the mobilisation is testimony to the growth in strength and unity of both the Namibian trade union movement, organised by the NUNW, and the student organisation, NANSO.

The wave of student protest and solidarity action began with student opposition to the location of military bases near to schools.

As the *Student Voice of Namibia* (the official organ of NANSO) puts it:

militarisation continues to be a daily aspect of the students' lives in our country, not only in the north but country-wide. Namibian students are daily faced with threats of military conscription in order to fight in a war which is not theirs, but a racist, colonial and capitalist war. Students of Namibia are daily faced with threats of military conscription, military repression and intimidation. The presence of the military bases near the schools, military repressive measures such as beatings, threats of military abductions are indeed obstacles to genuine educational progress in the country and remain continuing factors to the high failure rate in black schools. Ours is an education under military siege.

in March, students at the Ponghfi Secondary School on the border with Angola, boycotted classes, demanding the immediate withdrawal of the Ohangwena military base. Hishidimbua Ndeyapo, the Headmistress of the school, which houses 600 pupils, had often visited the military base to ask them to collect unexploded mortar bombs and she said some admitted firing mortars at the school 'in error'. In March half an hour after a PLAN military attack on the base, mortar fire hit the girls' dormitory killing 15 year old Albetina Nghikongelwa instantly; Victoria Nghikofa died some days later. Consequently students walked out, pledging not to return until the base had gone.

By June the boycott, led by NANSO, had spread, firstly in the north and then southwards to Windhoek, Katutura, Swakopmund, Arandis, Omarura, Gibeon and throughout the entire country.

In Katutura all schools went on strike at the beginning of June. Police hidden in vans invaded an early morning gathering of pupils planning their protest activities for the day, firing rubber bullets and using teargas and sjamboks. Two photographers were beaten up and arrested. Throughout Katutura students and bystanders were systematically attacked by police. Several students erected barricades by placing burning tyres and rocks on the roads.

Between 70 and 90% of the National workforce heeded the strike call; workers at meat factories, beverage factories, the postal service, railways and transport services all took action in solidarity with students.

Incidents of police assaults on striking workers were reported from Okahandja and Walvis Bay.

South Africa's Administrator-General Louis Pienaar, refused to move the bases, claiming they are there to 'protect the children'. The South African military responded to the boycott with brutal attacks on students and wholesale arrests of teachers, pupils and student leaders.

CALLED FOR ↓

a meeting of parents, students and teachers calling themselves a National People's Assembly and including the leadership of NANSO, issued a statement calling for a return to classes on the 19 July as a 'tactical move'. Paul Kalenga, President of NANSO said that although the bases had not been removed the strike had achieved 'one major objective — the uniting of the Namibian people against the presence of South African troops in Namibia'.

The National People's Assembly placed conditions on the return to classes. It demanded that the education authorities not victimise or intimidate students on their return. The Assembly restated the demand for the removal of army bases from schools in the north and threatened 'appropriate national action' if the demand was not met within four weeks of the reopening of schools.

Students at Rundu Secondary School are demanding the dismissal of four white teachers, who with the help of Koevoet, beat up pupils who participated in the boycott, before they return to the classroom.

The two day stayaway by workers demonstrates the strength of the Namibian labour movement. The NUNW now represents 70,000 workers, the vast majority of the country's workforce

Perhaps the most significant aspect of the recent mass mobilisation is the emergence of a student-worker alliance. Its importance was recognised by the National Students Congress, which took place just after the two day strike. NANSO adopted the following resolution:

Having critically analysed the Namibian liberation struggle and acknowledging the leading role of the workers in the struggle for social justice because of their decisive social power to bring about a meaningful change, further noting that during the recent student protest the workers concretely sided with the students by their solidarity action. We therefore resolve to concretise our relationship with the workers' unions organised under the banner of the National Union of Namibian Workers (NUNW). We also urge and encourage the branches to establish labour committees which will concentrate on giving substance to this worker-student alliance, based on the proper understanding between the branch and the union concerned. We further resolve that NANSO shall at all times act in unison with the workers in our struggle against the plundering of the wealth of the country and against capitalist exploitation.

'Our Struggle is your struggle'

An ad-hoc National School Crisis Committee has been set up to coordinate the work of local school crisis committees, disseminate information and assist students victimised as a result of the boycott. It aims to encourage the formation of democratic parent/student/teacher associations at all schools.

Thousands of young Namibians crossed the border into Angola in July in the wake of the school boycott. The schoolchildren and students, aged between 10 and 25, were being temporarily housed at the Namibian Transit Centre in Lubango in southern Angola while a United Nations airlift got underway to take them to Luanda. By the beginning of August the first 300 students had been airlifted to Luanda. UNICEF are assisting SWAPO in providing relief supplies. A further 1,800 students are still waiting to be airlifted and an estimated 3,500 had just reached Angola and were being helped to Lubango by PLAN combatants. A SWAPO official said they would be taken to schools in Kwanza Sul and other parts of Angola to enable them to get an education. Another 5,000 students are expected to arrive in Angola by April — G 22.7.88; INON.

The sudden arrival of thousands of young people into the SWAPO settlement will certainly put a strain on scarce resources. Please send any donations you can to help buy shoes, mosquito nets and medicines to NSC Medical Aid, PO BOX 16, London NW5 2LW

THE NATIONAL UNION OF HOSIERY AND KNITWEAR WORKERS (NUHKW) has been very positive in its stand against apartheid and one hundred per cent encourage and support members who take part in anti-apartheid activities.

Resolutions have been passed and acted upon and links forged with our sister union in South Africa. Until recently, however, the situation in Namibia and the Front Line States have been relatively unknown to us, being somewhat obscured by the happenings in South Africa and also through lack of reports in the media.


it was noted that our Union held shares in some companies that had investments in Namibia. It is the Union's policy to avoid investments in South Africa and the Union's head office is in the process of examining this question now with regard to Namibia.

A message of support, together with a miniature replica of our National Banner has been sent to the SWAPO Women's Council Weaving Project and the workers in the Kwanza Sul Settlement, Angola, and we are looking forward to a response. We hope that through SWAPO, links between our trade unions will develop. ■



STUDENTS STILL FIGHTING...

Have you heard the latest 'reason' they've come up with for denying lesbians & gay men their rights? Well, apparently we don't need college gaysoc to provide us with safe space to meet, hold discussions, socialise & organize, nor do we need lesbian & gay officers on student union executive bodies, because THERE ISN'T ANY DISCRIMINATION.

Well, pardon me folkies, but I reckon that it isn't up to the college governors to decide whether or not discrimination continues to affect the lesbian & gay community, it's up to us. And when we think prejudice & discrimination have ceased to exist we'll let them know (and then we'll all go off & party till we fall over probably, before running back to our safe jobs in our safe homes with our safe kids, happy, happy, happy). But I digress ... What's happened is that two colleges have recently used this argument against students' attempts to combat the effects of prejudice. The principal of LEEDS COLLEGE OF MUSIC refused to allow lesbian & gay students to form a gaysoc on the grounds that it might encourage 'goings on in the toilets' and 'the spread of AIDS' ... He was also dubious about the legality of such a society, in relation to Section 28, but nevertheless there was no need for a gaysoc because ... THERE ISN'T ANY DISCRIMINATION!

Leeds students & the NUS all thought this sounded a bit confusing, & when he said that lesbian & gay students who felt isolated could pass messages to each other through him, they knew he must be crazy. After a big campaign & a lot of publicity he finally relented, & we think things are better now (tell us if you know different tho'). But meanwhile, at the CAMBRIDGESHIRE COLLEGE OF ARTS & TECHNOLOGY the SU was having another big fight with the authorities At a General Meeting of the student body it was democratically decided that there should be a lesbian & gay officer on the exec., to look after lesbian & gay interests, especially anticipating the effect Section 28 was likely to have. The decision was unanimous on the part of the students but when the necessary constitutional amendment was taken to the governors for approval, they refused to ratify it. Three guesses what reasons they gave... It was the first time they'd

Martina Shanahan. Has she been framed?

Martina Shanahan, the 21 yr old Irish Woman who has been accused of conspiring to murder the Northern Ireland secretary Tom King is now on trial at Winchester crown court.

At her preliminary trial at Southwark earlier this year, several sp women went as legal observers (me included). The evidence that the prosecution gave was basically a load of crap. Stuff like 'they had a green wooly hat' and 'I saw one of them looking at a combat magazine'. They were of course found guilty.

The question is now, have Martina and the other 2 men been framed? It seems so. The trial at Winchester started on the exact same day as the conservative party conference in Brighton. With this came constant coverage of the Brighton bombings which took place 4 years ago by the IRA. With dramatic pictures of the injured, and the valiant face of Ms Thatcher, in came the next item, notice of the trial. This surely damned the trial even before it got started. The defence asked that her trial be put back a month in view of this, but it was not granted.

You can't be right on

Michelle-Shockod

SP rates there are a few misspellings but this article is legit. I'd be OK and Michelle wouldn't care.

THE TALE SO FAR....
Michelle shocked (Texan singer-songwriter, ex-punk, seasoned traveller and activist, survivor of 'psychiatric care' and a Mormon upbringing) arrives in London after her field recording *The Texas Campfire Tapes* (on the cooking vinyl label) leaps to success in the British Indie chart. Giggling constantly and recording a new record, she comes to the attention of SP and vice versa. They are mutually smitten. Shocked and Shocking - surley this is meant to be? On a march in London she meets SP and promises an interview but a combination of fame and elusivness keep them apart until a second chance meeting in a tryst (but the typesetter thinks it's a conversation), after the Cambridge leg of her national tour...battling with exhaustion and nerves they talk way into the night. Here's some of it.

Briefly, how would you define your politics?

Being brief?... Think for yourself, speak for yourself. Take 10 years to do what going to classes would teach you in 2 years. Teach yourself. It's the getting there that's important.

So you don't take on the political props—Marxist, Anarchist - philosophy?

Oh sure. I take bits & parts & there are times when something will come up & I'll be an advocate for a while, but I get over it.

What about being a woman in the music industry—I wondered how you felt about working in a studio for the first time, on the EP (If Love Was A Train)

It was a really confusing time for me cuz no one was really telling me what was going on. They started to have me work with this producer... I went on a pretty dogmatic clue really, seeing the way he treated his girlfriend, very patronizing, father-figure like. It was the same thing I put into making this LP with Peter Anderson who was really recommended to me. I couldn't see how, no matter how good a producer he was, I could work with him. I wasn't asking him to be that aware, but please—make it possible for me to spend more than 10 minutes at a time in your presence!

Have you thought about getting specifically women technicians to work with or are you more of the attitude that musical perfection is more important than positive discrimination?

It's a really important issue, you know? The positive discrimination side of it... But the other side, working with someone because they're a woman is like... well, I've worked with women who weren't that good either. There was

this woman I brought over from Texas, was going to be my fiddle-player, my mate, was going to be like, solid. There with me. I just had a really bad experience with her. Whatever power I gave her, she'd turn round and give it to a man. So...

I realize I've been given a lot of power & the support I get comes from women—just wild women, outspoken women, YEAH!!! women... but I try to translate that. It's like, if someone gives you a dollar... I take the power I'm given by women & I translate it. As far as I'm concerned my real focus is racism. That's what I actually do—instead of taking the pound that's given to me & spending it again on women, I try to invest that support in something I feel has a lot less self interest. I don't think it matters that it isn't always an integrated audience. Coming from this culture & considering the music I play it's perfectly valid to focus on raising the consciousness of white people about racism.

That's interesting, what you've just said about racism—I read something you'd said a while ago that sexism was a man's problem. Sounds like here you're trying to get through to white audiences for the same reason.

That awareness came to me through my own experience of feminism. I went through a separatist period & I can perfectly understand now why we've been isolated by the rest of humanity, why we actually think pink is flesh coloured. We've been boycotted just like I was so willing in a way to boycott half the population.

Do you think there is a place for separatism?

That goes into my insights about when I was in a women's village in Italy & I was completely isolated & separate the kind of scene where women's culture thrives. It's actually the same point that's been manipulated & used horribly against me with my discussions about Greenham. I'm glad it exists but I won't go there. I've already been through that process, I feel like, as a result of growing up in a separate community of fundamentalists, I know the dangers too well, what happens when like-minded people get together. you can't say that Greenham has total consensus you know—it's just a culture that's been created for things to be worked out. That makes me glad—but I'll tell you this right—when I was at this women's village it was right after I'd been raped & what I actually experienced was not the security & sanctuary, but more like jumping form the fire into the frying pan. Things didn't get better or easier here, they got worse. The conditions that the women were living in, as a result of their decision to live outside society which had strong consequences—the poverty, pressure from

the police. You could see real easily how witch hunts happened, in that sort of context with just a little more antagonism. They were just regarded by the community around them as... something to tell children creepy stories about.

You've got a big following amongst young lesbian women over here. Why do you think that is?

Cos they're wild & wicked. **Something else you said once—that you're waiting for a revolution doesn't require a certain shoe-style** Yeah!

I really liked that, but you LOOK like you fit in with the revolutionary 'scene' here, so is this just a matter of principle 'cos you've GOT the right shoes... (Michelle's wearing battered hi-tops inscribed with symbols on the toes)

It is. It's more like the idea where you go 'I'm not saying I'm a politician but I always know what to wear when I'm invited to a party'.

What do you LIKE about Britain?

The thing I've been using to explain why I live here & not in America was really made strong for me at that Clause 28 demonstration where you had trade unions, students, the arts community, all coming out in support of what could've been portrayed in the media as just a lesbian & gay issue. And that's something I never was able to experience in America. I say when you go out on the street that's only part of the work. It's the same thing behind squatting—you cannot survive as a squat if you just say well we're going to take care of ourselves—the 1st point is you go & squat the building, & your 2nd job is to go & explain to the people living next door what you're doing. Cos if you don't do that you're not going to have the support you need when the police come & start evicting. And I find because of the socialist tradition in England you don't have to work on the fringes quite so much. A while ago in the Castro district of San Francisco, it occured to me for the 1st time that a community & a ghetto both look the same to an outsider. In America people are very willing to accept the rule of being a victim of ghetto-ization, they think it's their lot. They're outside the mainstream, the majority, so they obviously deserve to be put somewhere where they're neither seen nor heard and within that context they make it comfy or cosy. I feel that here, for all the contradictions, the tradition of working inside and outside the system will probably prove most effective. I really relate to that right now.

The revolution's going to start here?

No... I don't know about that, I was in Toronto this summer... it might start there. Now I tell you what, there's going to be a really fantastic gathering in San Francisco next summer.



And speaking of using shapes to satisfy needs, it seems that sexual stereotyping in China, is en route towards the typical western exploitation of the female form.



Included in this guideline is, how to handle disruptive behaviour, (up the SP revolution) and other information which is so secret that even i can't work them out. Anyhow, after getting nowhere with her request, she travelled to Somerset from Buckinghamshire to put her complaints in a face to

after this tete-a-tete the QC Mr Barnet said he could see no objections and wrote to the secretary of state on her behalf. Rachel said afterward: 'I regard this as an important victory, what seems odd is that the clauses they seem so concerned to keep secret say very little'.





Youth unemployment banned!

The government has yet again changed the way it counts unemployment. It has decided everyone under 18 is either in fulltime education or on a Youth Training Scheme.


At a stroke of a pen this means over 100,000 unemployed teenagers will no longer be classified as unemployed and will no longer get any benefits.

Theresa Court's mother Yvonne Rideout, 43, of Aberbargoed, has already admitted a charge of actual bodily harm.




The SM Lesbian Debate of all Time....
..... happened at Wesley House Women's Centre London this summer. You missed it? Never mind, here is a precis of what went down at the Face to Face Lesbian Debate of Sadó Masochism:

There were masses of women in the main hall. There was a panel of speakers on the stage, supposedly with a range of viewpoints from Pro to Con SM— Annie Toone from Chain reaction a Lesbian SM club in London, Chris Tchaikovsky, Barbara Smith, Sue Fruman & Linda Bellos ex leader of Lambeth council, Labour party councillor, Black feminist lesbian mother, and Sheila Jeffreys who said she would be there to champion the Anti SM stance, but she took one look into the hall and bottled out. Maybe the sea of leather studded jackets unnerved her for she ran upstairs to create an SM free zone. Now this WAS a piss off especially for our Linda who at one stage was the only articulate voice against SM, taking on the whole SM crew single handedly. (See photo). Because of Sheila Jeffreys last minute withdrawal, it looked as though the SM's were going to dominate the debate. Dressed to kill in rubber, leather, chains and sexy brassiers the SM dykes looked like the sexiest football hooligan 'firm' I'd seen in a long while. Every time one of their side spoke, they all stomped their docs and roared in

support, Chelsea terraces style. Very impressive group identification I thought. Yet when the debate was thrown open to the floor in the 2nd half and individual SM's spoke I felt they came across as sexy & sensitive, if not overly politically aware. Claims for SM ranged from....
★ It's theraputic: you can reenact your childhood abuse, with your lesbian lover as your attacker, and somehow you are reclaiming the experience and translating it into something you can cope with—THIS I found very dodgy.
★ Women who had been abused identify with SM. They feel that other SM dykes understand in a way that non SM people never will. They feel that at last they have found other women who know where they

are coming from.— This could also do with some analysis ie. another way of looking at the above is to suggest that these women have internalised the brutalisation they have been subjected to.
Not all SM'ers thought of SM sex this way. I was very swayed by a woman who explained SM as a way of heightening sexual tensions, frustrating your lover, making them wait for it, biting them & so on—bringed inviting to me.
Next was the claim (★) that SM was empowering. Well I'm sure that rapists think that rape is empowering, and bosses fucking their secretaries as well as the rest of the staff find it empowering—but it's a bad power. (bad? you know, evil degenerative downward spiralling etc), that I would be

worried about unleashing, considering it's what fucks up the planet.
'Image', and how it is interpreted, was a biggie. some women find the SM's threatening with their bondage collars & swastikas. The reply from SM's was that men in suits are the ones to be wary of, yet nobody shies away from them in the street.
Other ideas which came up..... Symbols of oppression—are weddingdresses & wedding rings the real symbols of oppression? Can we reclaim & transform the meaning of these by wearing these too? Is SM a mind thing? A power play game? Can you have an SM relationship over the phone?
Whatever the answer the debate had a brilliant buzz precisely because of the very different viewpoints & wide spectrum of women who put their say forward— from Vanilla (term suggesting home baking and nice friendly mama, which describes non SM women) to shades of scarlet fantastic and even shocking pink. Lots of american women had their say too and apparently we're well behind the times here in Britain.



WITH JACKIE KAY →

Twice Over makes history as the first (It's taken a long time) play written by a Black person, to be produced by the famous Gay sweatshop theatre company.

The play which starts with a funeral, where members of the family gather and grieve, the solitary figure of a grieving woman friend, is weaved around the families sorrow. Maeve, much loved and cherished by all who knew her has died, leaving loads of personal belongings. The accumulation of a life times existence and association. The job of sifting through the clutter is left to her grand daughter Evaki, quite bored at the prospect she digs around: 'there's so much junk, how could grandmar have collected so many things?'. She struggles through this one womans story, unaware that a spritual hand is guiding her (it's not as serious as it sounds as we see Maeve remeber sadly deceased right through the play giving direction to her family and friends: oh i'm fed up with all this lying, i did it while i was living, i'll be damed if i'm gonna do it whilst i'm dead!. She places objects in front of her grand daughter so that she may know the truth. That her dearest granmum lived and loved another woman (gasp) photographs, letters and journals are found to indicate the undeniable but yet unmentionable fact that Maeve at last breath, and in her 60's was having love with her friend of some forty years and was still getting plenty before she died, this was just a technical hitch anyhow. As the play unfolds we are introduced to other people in her life, Jean her friend, very very snatty know what i mean. A young friend of Maeves and Evaki's Tash who spends all


of her time drawing and dreaming, (i wanted to tell her that she was a dyke, but i held back as i was so enthralled with the dialouge and deliverie of the actresses involved in this very special play.

We meet Sharon, worried about boys, pregnancy, Aids and make up, jewellery, cuddly toys, i'll resist the cliches, she's looking for excitement. And Maves long time sweet heart and good time gran Cora, sad, low resentful, depressed, with no one to talk to and no one to

mean totally insensitively tells Cora that she knows everything. Good time gran denies, then resents, then admits her true feelings, her true love was the best in the bussiness and that she had been such a fool to deny the only warm thing to have happened to her since they made thermal underwear in this cold country. All are reconciled and Maeve's spirit can rest with the knowledge that her story has been finally aired to all she knew and all who never even saw her before in her life

After Twice Over we interviewed Jackie Kay (who'd been watching the play).

SP: You're the first Black writer to have a play performed by Gay Sweatshop?

Jackie: Yes, I wrote my first play Chiarascuro earlier in 1986, and Twice Over was commisioned by another group, but there was trouble and hassle there and I withdrew it. Then Gay Sweatshop took it on and did a reading of it and liked it. I've rewritten it since then.

SP: Were you involved in directing it and did the actors play a part in developing the characters at rehearsal?

J: No I didn't direct it. The director Nona Shepphard did it exactly as I'd've wanted - and the set is what I'd DREAMED of. It was really exciting when I first saw it. For Chiarascuro the actors and me did work together, but for Twice Over I wrote the script and then they did it all. They stuck right to the script. The actors create more on top of the characters written in the script

SP: Are the audiences the play gets the audiences you are trying to contact?

J: I'm happy with this audience at the Drill Hall, and I'd be happy

with other ones - as a Lesbian there's not a lot to see that's written for us. I write for Lesbians and also want straight people to see it eg my parents in Glasgow.

SP: Is Twice Over based on your personal experiences?

J: I think every writer writes from experience but I'm not any of the characters in Twice Over. My

Grandmother's white so there's a mixture of Black and White people in my family but none of the characters are based on any of them.

SP: How did you get into writing?

J: I've written since I was very young. But my writings and plays weren't published or performed until I came to London. I had a great English teacher at school who encouraged me. There were no Black Lesbians in Glasgow except me so I came down to London and found some.

SP: Do you want to do other things like directing?

J: I know my limits - I can write and try to improve on it. I'd like to write film scripts. I wrote a documentary for BBC2 Split Screen, against porn and I'd like to do more like that. I'm more pleased with Twice Over than Chiarascuro. I think I had more confidence. It's simpler. It's

about 2 women who love each other, grief and secrets.

SP: It's got a lot of humour

J: Yes. I think I crammed a lot into Chiarascuro, a lot of information about all the characters. I had a lot to say. Also I prefer the new writing of Twice Over to the reading - I got away from some of the more usual settings - I put the 3 young women out of school when they were with each other and changed a scene where originally they did some some graffiti to them stealing some champagne, I wrote out their school teacher and put in one of Cora and Maeve's friends / work-mates instead. Everyone's got a secret - some of them you don't find out about eg Jean, you don't know her secret.

SP: You do?

J: Yes!

CIRCLES - WOMENS FILM AND VIDEO DISTRIBUTION

In the middle of London's East End, half way up Roman Road you may be surprised to hear that there lies one of the most useful and radical resource centres available for women.

I refer to Circles a 'video shop' with a difference. Inside lies a roomful of all films you ever wanted to see (well almost.) When I arrived to ask Jenny about Circles, the workers were 'cleaning' (or whatever the technical term is) a film about raving lesbian vampires. 'I will save up all my pennies to hire a video recorder' I thought as I got talking to Jenny about how the centre got started.

This is what she told me: 'Circles was started originally about eight years ago by a group of women film makers in protest at the fact that there were very few channels and outlets for their work. They were all independently into making film, not really working commercially. It grew when we got a grant from the GLC. The originators were very experimental and avant garde and approached Four Corners for the use of these rooms, having used their facilities before. We share a premises with Four Corners downstairs which is a mixed workshop. We also share access to a thirty seater cinema with them at the moment. Our income is partly generated by hires and sales of videos and as well as being a distributive centre there is a technical element to Circles too.'

The room we were sitting in was fairly tiny although really well organised. There are three part time workers at Circles and it is run on the collective basis.

I asked Jenny who used Circles and if custom has been affected by Clause 28.

"Cinemas use Circles films as shorts; teachers use them in schools; individuals use them at screenings for groups or to research a specific topic. We have found that lots of people, especially in education, are reluctant to use Circles now as a lot of the selection is about lesbian lifestyles and sexuality. They are backing off and no longer tend to book out material, because of Clause 28."

Yet Circles is unique. Throughout the rest of the world there is nothing similar. It is vital that women have easy access to films of this nature by ourselves, for ourselves. The Circles catalogues which list all films under subject headings such as arts, early women film makers, family media, health, animation etc. sell at £3.50 (incl p&p) There are over 200 films listed, something for everyone, as they say in the holiday camp ads.



THAT TIME OF THE MONTH (25 mins)

Words that often come up in this film are 'embarrassed', 'ashamed', 'lack of communication', 'confusion', 'am I abnormal?'

It's about periods. That little number that isn't talked about.

A group of Liverpool girls have put a lot of effort into saying: 'Don't worry girls, we're all going through it,' and the result is an amusing film which covers all aspects of the delights and traumas of starting your period, telling your Mum, discovering your ovaries, choosing which tampons etc.

It's a bit confusing at times and a shame that its squashed into 25 minutes. But better than those crap sex education sessions any day!

THE TIGER'S MILK - WOMEN OF NICARAGUA (30 mins)

Its not often that we get to hear about the specific plight of women when we're finding out about a political situation somewhere.

In Tiger's Milk however, we are shown, using mostly black and white stills and the narration of a Nicaraguan Creole woman the history of women from the Samoza dictatorship through the revolution, to the present date. Women's participation in the war against the US, in Trade Unions, and health and literacy projects has led to a strong sense of solidarity and a new pride and self-confidence. This film teaches you a lot whilst at the same time being exciting, atmospheric and really well made.

17 ROOMS - Or What do lesbians do in bed?

(10 mins)

This pacey, honest and direct film violently attacks the negative images that are presented of lesbians in society. The lesbian orgy stereotype, designed to titilate the voyeuristic male is spat on, screamed at, stamped into the mud and chucked off the tallest tower block.

The inquisitive watcher will find that what lesbians really do in bed is eat, drink, watch the telly, kiss, have pillow fights and entertain the cat.

Oh yes, lesbians sometimes even bow their noses in bed to....

I couldn't really work out who this film was made for though. Is it fun for the enlightened or enlightenment for the searcher of titilation?, or both....?

CHOOSING CHILDREN (45 mins)

'Two Mums can be better than one!'


Even if Motherhood and babies seem a million miles from some of us, this film is really enlightening and interesting, and of relevance to women of all ages.



Britain had been exploiting India since before the 17th Century, though the system known as 'Colonialism'. Trousers are irrelevant to women. A fairly recent invention in their present form, they were designed for men, hence the zipper at the front—a pointless and generally unsightly addition to any female's garment. Would any self respecting woman wear a skirt with a zipper halfway down the front of it (except as an imitation of men's jeans)? Trousers do not really suit women either. Unless the female in question is anorexically thin, they tend to mold gentle curves into uncomplimentary bulges.

The argument that trousers allow greater freedom of movement is a myth. Not all dresses and skirts are tight and constricting, nor too full to hamper energetic movement. And the idea that some dresses/skirts are too short for free movement is also a myth; the problem is not so much about the length but getting over our inhibitions about showing our knickers—there's actually nothing indecent about climbing a tree in a ra-ra-skirt. We show equal amounts of mingy bits in shorts, swimming costumes, tight jeans etc. Providing they are a sensible fit, we should be no more embarrassed about revealing our underwear in the process of jumping a fence than bikini bottoms when going for a swim. While on the subject of physical movement I would like to point out the difference in comfort and convenience when trying to have a pee (or perhaps an intimate gropey rumpy session) in the bushes, between a medium length dress & stockings and the average pair of Levis.

It has been said that wearing dresses implies being more of a sexual invitation to men, but this obviously depends much more on the style of the clothing and the manner of the wearer than the type of garment itself, eg skin tight trousers and a nuns habit. In general most trousers reveal a lot more of the female figure (especially with the top tucked in) than the average dress or skirt. However, I do accept that other people's attitudes result in the situation where women in dresses get more open sexual harassment than those who choose to wear trousers. The stereotypical dowdy dungareed dyke gets harassment of a different nature.

Let us reclaim stockings from the pornographers! Stockings are practical, economical, no more uncomfortable to wear than trousers and far less sweaty and unhygienic than tights (ask anyone who has suffered from thrush). Tights coincided with the shortening of skirts to ironically emphasise women's new accessibility to men (more birth control and permissiveness) while preventing them from showing their knickers which were, unhelpfully, getting skimpier and less utilitarian at the same time.

As I have stated from the first, trousers were invented for men's comfort, not women's. Women began wearing them when the Western alternatives were only the ridiculous corsets and crinolines of the time. We can now reclaim skirts/dresses/stockings for women instead of leaving those gorgeous garments as purely titillatory objects for men to use against us: to distinguish between male and female hospital workers/schoolchildren/police and thereby set them up for discrimination and harassment, or "Put your stockings on for me tonight Dear".

WAYS TO DO THIS ARE:-

- Get men to wear dresses too
- Wear skirts/dresses/stockings on everyday occasions—not just formal or festive events
- Don't be afraid to be physically active in them (get a pair of big, brightly coloured baggy knickers)
- Experiment with the clothing of other cultures which often flatter or emphasise the parts of the body Western female clothing doesn't, like thighs and pregnant bellies
- Don't worry about letting your stockings rip—they are designed to in order to make us stop running around too much for fear of damaging them (it has been possible for years to produce stockings that don't snag, but not very economical for companies like Pretty Polly)
- DEFY STEREOTYPES—mix dainty demure dresses with Doc Martins
- USE SHOCK TACTICS—surprise friends and neighbours by sporting immaculate 50's bridal wear and spouting obscenities or demonstrating Karate techniques on those who give you hassle on the way home from work, school etc




Oh, but it is. Well what happened to you, has.

Four years is a long time ago. Yes. But god, it's so hard. Well I can remember coming home from school, it was raining really hard. I opened the door; I could already hear them shouting, really him shouting and Mum, oh god, Mum crying, screaming at me to help her. I ran in there, into the kitchen and she was on the floor.

Hey, it's O.K. We can stop here if you want.

No, I'll carry on. She, well, her mouth all blood was running down it. Her eye all puffed out and purple. That was the first time. She looked so feeble and weak. He was just standing there. That was the first time he hit you?

Hey! Freedom and Education '88—A Day Conference.

Sounds good! A member of the Shocking Pink Collective went along to check out this event on October 1st (bravely getting up at 6am to get a coach I might add) which happens in Leicester yearly, organised by the Libertarian Education Collective. (They put out an excellent mag called LIBED— Write to LIBED The Cottage, The Green, Leire, Leicester LE17 5HL.

Particularly of interest to you readers out there would be the first workshop our SP went to—'WORKING WITH GIRLS—this workshop will include contributions from individuals with a wide and varied experience of working with girls, in schools, in the youth service & in the community/ (Other spicely workshops included—challenging-Racism, the Baker Bills, Let's get away from schooling, sexism in education and young people's rights.)

The majority of the people taking part in this discussion were white women employed specifically to 'work with girls' as teachers etc. There was a small minority of Black and Asian women, a handful of young women between 10 & 19, and one man. There wasn't very much in depth communication between the young women ('the worked with') present and the women 'working with' then which our SP rep thought unfortunate. After all, a workshop about girls/young women should surely focus on what we want from those in the powerful position of 'working with' us (a power/authority usually not recognised by those who have it). Instead the workshop focussed on the trials & tribulations of the teachers/youth workers and their attempts at promoting young women's position etc, which is, of course, also a very necessary & valid topic for discussion.....

Topics included images of women in books for children/young people, and how to create positive imagery (not too many imaginative suggestions here apart from to hassle publishers), (SHOCKING PINK IN THE CURRICULUM NOW!), how to build confidence in young women (they're going to force feed us on steroids haha joke), the possibility of creating change in the classroom, the problems of mixed sex youth groups, and some really good feedback about a new young women's group and a just forming Black young women's group.

As far as Young Lesbians in schools etc and Clause 28—nothing very constructive came out of talking about this. To be a lesbian in school/a youth group/college is a pretty scary thing sometimes, especially if you are isolated/surrounded by homophobia/not in contact with any positive representation of lesbians/find your sexuality in lessons from sex education to history/(have pink hair, a pierced eyelid and a woman's symbol tattooed on your face).

Our SP rep is still unconvinced that any real discussion of any form of sexuality is introduced by teachers (except for a few interesting stories related at this workshop) in schools, and the situation certainly isn't getting any better with clause 28 looming down on everyone. Apparently an Oxfordshire local authority has been placing notices in the school staff rooms that say it is not permitted to discuss homosexuality in the classroom unless in reference to the transmission of diseases!!! (but the teacher telling us this hadn't ripped it down, of course.)

In discussing 'mixed' youth groups, most people seemed to think that most 'mixed' groups could effectively be called 'boys groups' as it generally is boys who control what goes on in the groups. Similarly, in classroom situations, the boys dominate. Some women felt that actually raising the issue with the male members of the class/group might possibly make them change ie if they felt they were seriously pissing OFF the girls in the group they might change. Here the discussion led into 'control' (though perhaps it was phrased a little more gently)—how does the teacher/youth worker GET THE KIDS TO DO WHAT THEY WANT? At this point our SP gal got in a real huff and brought up the point that young people, WIMMIN in particular are ALWAYS expected to look to some authority figure to sort things out—it is always a case of a teacher/youthworker/socialworker/policeman/lawyer intervening in our lives to sort out what they think needs dealing with! What about encouraging young/people to take responsibility and deal with problems like this WITH EVERYONES participation? Blokes tend to think they can get away with bullshit because they don't really have to answer to their friends/peers—just some teacher for whom (like it or not!) they don't have much respect. This suggestion was encouragingly well received, and different possibilities for group discussions.



The best part of the workshop—the challenge to the world of Boys Groups—young womens groups.

Several amazon warriors from Lemington Spa told the so far successful story of the forming of their new Young Women's group. Our girlie form SP found it irritating that the Youth worker (much as she respected her and admired her hard work) who came with them felt it necessary to act virtually as translator of what was said to the other adults present. The group, besides being a lot of fun, giving the women lots of confidence (they now plan to take over all of Warwickshire), has gained them mountains of respect at the centre. Some of these wild super-women now plan to start a Black/Asian Young women's group where they can discuss various aspects of their lives that are relevant to only them (ie. arranged marriages, culture, strict upbringings), build up confidence and support for each other and do what they want WITHOUT THE BOYS. But the fact that the woman youth worker is white, and the non white youth worker is a man has apparently caused some delays...! 'Why not set up the group WITHOUT a youth worker'—(that trouble maker from Shocking Pink again)—this suggestion got everybody talking—quick to write off the possibility before it could even be considered, the young women were discouraged and said they felt parents/legal stuff/transport would make it impossible. But they seemed determined to get the group together and Shocking Pink has been promised reports/articles as soon as things get happening.
