The United States' first reported case of apparent AIDS transmission through oral sex has raised concerns for both lesbian and heterosexual women.

The case involves a man whose only sexual or other risky activity was regular oral sex with a prostitute whom he says used intravenous drugs. Over a period of two years, the man both performed and received oral sex with the woman, who has not been tested for the virus that causes AIDS. The man subsequently tested positive for antibodies to the virus, a sign that he is infected.

Public health officials have concluded that the man almost certainly became infected through oral sex, making this case the first confirmed case of transmission by this route.

But while this case should increase awareness of the possible risk from oral sex, it has not changed the advice of public health officials, who have been saying for some time now that oral sex carries some risk of transmission. It has been known for some time that HIV, the virus that causes AIDS, is found in saliva and in vaginal secretions as well as in semen, but the concentrations are lower. Furthermore, some chemicals in saliva are believed to have a protective effect, lowering the risk of infection for a person performing oral sex. Cuts or sores in the mouth, on the other hand, increase the risk of transmission.

Women performing oral sex on their partners, particularly if they have any cuts or sores in their mouths or if their partners are HIV-positive or have engaged in high risk activities, should consider lowering their risk by using barriers (condoms or dental dams) and otherwise avoiding contact with their partners' bodily fluids.

 HIV is the virus that has been known to cause AIDS syndrome. You cannot catch AIDS.

AIDS syndrome is not one disease, but a group of diseases associated with the HIV virus.

 HIV is present in bodily fluids, namely blood, semen, and vaginal secretions.

 HIV can be transmitted through having unprotected anal, vaginal or oral sex, and also through sharing needles. You cannot get HIV from kissing, holding hands, from swimming pools or toilets, or from touching a person with HIV or AIDS.

PREVENTION: Obviously, avoiding contact with bodily fluids is the way to prevent the transmission of the HIV virus. -Great. What do I do?

 Use a condom when having any kind of intercourse, or when giving someone a blow job.

 Do not have unprotected oral sex with a woman when she's on her period. Use dental dams... or improvise. Condoms work better and are cheaper and easy to find... just cut off both ends, and slit it up the side to form a latex square. Place the square over your mouth or your partner's vagina- and have fun. Lesbians DO have to worry about safe sex... ps. it's a good idea to do this all the time, or at least when you're making love...

 It would be nice if we could all be in straight, monogamous relationships wouldn't it? Of course not, but that's what Maggie thinks (that's cause she never has sex). It's not the number of partners you have that will put you at risk for the HIV virus, but whether or not you practise safe sex. A person who has one lover and doesn't practise safe sex is at a higher risk than. someone who had 10 lovers and was: safe with all of them.

LENOR. I wonder if they look at women and think that all women look the same?


(No one knew the answer to this question. Ed.) **LENOR**, I don't know ANY bloke who oozes sex. I can't even imagine one.


after woman cleared of assault

A JUDGE branded two Metropolitan Police officers as liars yesterday and said that their contempt for the public could lead to juries disbelleving what any police officer says in court. Judge Geoffrey Rucker made his comments at Southwark crown court, south London, after quashing a conviction against a woman who had been charged with assaulting and insulting two constables.

Mrs Cheryll Holland, aged 36, from Morden, was arrested by PCs James Kellett and Simon Hartfield about a road tax disc in March as she arrived to open her mother's flower shop.

The police alleged that she locked herself inside the shop and shouted through the letter box. At the appeal hearing yesterday a postman confirmed the shop had no letter box. She was detained for four hours and last April was given a conditional discharge.

The judge said he was appalled "that police officers who are there to protect us are prepared to perjure themselves over a matter as trivial as this."

Fumi was lied to, tricked (told if she accepted their charges her daughter could be returned to her), and also not informed of her rights to see a solicitor and make a phone call.

In prison, black women are stereotyped more often as unemployed, single parents, living below the poverty line and in poor housing. Their children are taken away from them as they are likely to be seen as "unfit mothers". This becomes more likely as a result, because they often lose their council flats while in prison because of rent arrears.

Parole to see children and family becomes harder and attempts to regain custody of children are harder as they no longer have a home and fixed address. TRAGIC: Black women sent to prison suffer more than their white counterparts.

Racial discrimination as well as female harassment is widespread in prison. Derogatory comments and more frequent strip searches are common examples. When one woman complained about the state of the toilet the prison officer said "YOU ARE LUCKY TO HAVE ONE. IN YOUR COUNTRY YOU WOULD HAVE TO GO TO THE BUSH"

Today 19% of women prisoners are black even though ethnic minorities only make up 5% of this countries population.

The adMinistry of Truth on Food Irradiation

This September parliament will be debating a bill to introduce food irradiation. Banned in this country since 1967, the new bill hopes to bring us in line with other EEC countries where food irradiation is a standard practice. The food industry and the government are keen to see the bill passedas is the ailing nuclear industry. For them, food irradiation could be another 'nice little earner''. For us, the lowly consumer, food irradiation poses a major threat to our well being, by denying our bodies the whole food needed to both heal and maintain vital energy

So what is food irradiation? It is a form of food sterilisation, whereby large doses of gamma rays are directed at the food's molecular construction. Gamma rays are such an energetic force that they literally knock the living daylights out of foodstuffs by disrupting their life systems. Whilst this suspends all life, it also prevents ripening and rotting- whilst still higher doses kill pests, bacteria and viruses. Therefore food irradiation acts as a preservative. The gamma rays themselves have to come from a source of radiation-namely Caesium 137. By happy chance, Caesium 137 is in plentiful supply in the waste from nuclear power stations. They couldn't bury it or sink it at sea, so now we've got to eat it- and pay for the privilege. It is important to stress that at "recom-mended levels" the food does not become radioactive. However if equipment being used developed a fault or food got "dosed" several times if left trundling around on the conveyor belt, then the food could indeed become radioactive.

Because the food has been sterilised and stripped of life by irradiation, it follows that its nutritional qualities will be affected. In potatoes irradiation can kill off half the Vitamin C content- and continues to deplete it in storage. Add to that the usual 50% loss in cooking and you end up with a nutritional non-entity. This has serious implication for those on low incomes where potatoes play a central role in the diet. Fish & rice lose a quarter of their B Vitamins-and that's before cooking. Painful periods and pre-menstrual tension are symptoms of lack of B Vitamins, but ultimately vitamin deficiences drain the life force and set up a process of dis-ease.

Food irradiation also alters the taste of some foods. Dairy produce can taste chalky, meat develops a "wet dog" smell amd celery turns brown. Obviously a chemical change has occured in the foodstuff, which could present a danger to health. The

food industry has done the usual experiments on animals to reassure us that there's no safety hazard. However besides the issue of cruelty to animalsanimal experiments are known to be unreliablelook at the Thalidomide disaster of the 60's for proof of that. Not only are animals a completely different species from us, but how likely are we to eat irradiated chicken three times a day for three weeks and then stop? Has every foodstuff been tested? What about combinations of foodstuffs eaten over ten years? There are high residues of pesticides and fungicides in our foods already-how do these chemicals react when shaken about by gamma rays? Do they produce new and unknown toxins? Ouestions, questions and pitifully few answers for a food process already in use for a number of years.

One of the bogus claims of the pro-food irradiation lobby is that the process will do away with unpopular additives, flavourings and preservatives. In fact the opposite is the case, as it becomes necessary to mask bad smells, revive colour and restore flavours.

vatives may still have to be used to kill off any remaining bacteria, in the food. It has also been said that food irradiation would see an end to the outbreaks of salmonella that the popular press has been busy bringing to our attention. However whilst salmonellae in poultry is killed in the irradiation process- botulism bacteria is not. Botulism is a much more dangerous form of food poisoning than salmonella- indeed it usually kills. Because the radiation kills off the organisms that give meat its rotting smell, it will be impossible to tell whether the meat (or vegetable) is unfit to eat. Although it is illegal to "clean up" dirty produce by irradiation factory farming techniques contribute to unhealthy produce (witness the salmonella in eggs affair) it is known to go on.

On top of these problems irradiated food is known to bruise more easily and become more prone to funghal and insect attack. Therefore the storage problems become more, not less. Yet the myth being perpetuated to the public is that irradiated food means an end to food going off and causing food poisoning. Will stored food be rigorously checked for developing infestations and kept religiously at the right temperature? And who will check that the individual consumer does all these things? As usual it's not the food industry's problem. No question here of the polluter pays the price principle.

By now you may be wondering-given all the above drawbacks why the food industry even wants to bother with the irradiation of food. As with all things capitalist- it comes down to profits. The food and nuclear industries operate on the same economic system that was put into use in the Industrial Revolution and is still practiced with a vengance today. This system employs three basic principles;

Expanding the market
 Increasing efficiency

3. Technological advances.

Thus the food industry must expand-but there is only so much that the population of Britain can cat. The answer is to make trade more internationaland the irradiation of food will ensure that food does not perish when shipped over vast distances. Coupled with mass advertising (over 300 million a year by the food industry compared to the Health Education Council's budget of £250,000 a year to promote healthy eating) to prepare a "new market" to the wonders of food irradiation, the industry looks set to achieve its goal of constant growth.

Efficiency is the food industry's next aim in order to cut costs as much as

possible. Because the industry is so huge, it is no problem to buy the latest irradiation plant and place it next to huge stores of the raw materials required. The distributors will then be able to stockpile large quantities of goods, and exercise great control over what they supply to retailers. The stores will cater for large transporters which can then shift the goods to huge out of town shopping complexes-no question of cheaper goods for small corner shops in narrow streets. Food irradiation is invaluable in that it prolongs storage life and cuts down on wasted produce. Inevitably small firms could suffer from increased competition and fewer more automated storage centres spell job losses too.

Finally there is the question of technological advance. Since the industrial revolution, it has been the aim of most businesses to do away with workers whenever possible-or to deskill their jobs and this reduce the wages bill. Advance means bigger machinary, and its dependence on increasing supplies of the earths dwindling resources. Never mind that there is only so much expansion that we can take-or that future generations may be left impoverished. And what does the food industry care of job losses? People are still consumers, and in need of food-even if their spending power is reduced to a giro cheque. Advance also means to up-date your product. Back in 1985, the farmers

union agreed that the "Way Forward" in recognition of a static market was to shift towards "higher value products" and to invest in research so that "new and exciting products" may be developed. Hence we have the humble potato converted into numerous highly processed nutritionally disastrous and highly priced "potato snacks". And now "research" has provided us with the gift of food irradiation.

industries-linked with agribusinedd and all its army of chemicals and heavy nmachinary. We are nothing without safe clean food - we are what we eat. Don't let business interests corner us into accepting irradiated food laced with chemical residues and liberal doses of additives. Watch out for the sale of irradiated goods and refuse them. By eating such processed food not only is there a risk of ill healthbut also the endorsement of a greeedy and selfish ecomonic system that only serves to enslave us to faceless profiteers. *note-Much thanks to the Wales Green Party for their info leaflet on Food Irradiation. emember those fabulous "dining out girls"? "The wartime business girl is to be seen any night dining out alone or with a friend in the moderate priced restaurants in London. Formerly she would have never have had her evening meal in town unless in the company of a man friend. But now with money and without men she is more and more beginning to dine out.

The Daily Mail. 1915.

During the years 1914-1918-such a short period historically; British women threw away the constraints of the Victorian age that had bound them to the "home" and embraced the Brave New World. Whilst men engaged in the most widespread war-faring ever experienced, women had been waging their own Great War. Here is their story ...


Until the advent of the first world war women were still expected to fit in with the images that Victorian society had assigned to them, and which Edwardian men were only too happy to see continue. Since the French Revolution of the 1790's the middle classes had sought to establish a degree of stability in that now wellknown myth-and power structure-the Nuclear Family. Gone was the preindustrialized family in which everyone did their part. In the new system the perfect wife and mother was the centre of the private domain of the home. The outside world was the wicked world of moneymaking, coalmines, ironworks, poverty, disease, crime, and other foul deeds (e.g.Freemasonery).

The perfect "Lady" was married, brought forth sons, felt no sexual desires and above all was idle. The husband's wage was supposed to provide servants, cooks, nurses and governesses. On top of all this the "perfect lady" was of a delicate nature, and frequently unwell. Furthermore she was also stunted intellectually. As one wanker wrote in a popular magazine of the time "Temple Bar"

"In some things she is as ignorant as a child, but hers is a blessed ignorance... little Betty's mind is more eager to watch the flight of swallows or inquire into the growth of roses than to learn the distinction of shillings, pounds and pence, and I would not have her different."

Women of this time, indeed Edwardian women experiencing the war, have been much affected by this image. To not conform to it meant punishment in one form or another, and men had much to lose by women rejecting such a passive and powerless role.

§ Episode One §



Before the outbreak of war the lot of most women was back-breaking work, either in the home in the fight against dirt and disease or in the various other options open to them. At the lower end of the scale this included work at the coal tips, employment in the cotton mills (mostly single women) and the various "sweated" trades. These trades, such as dressmaking, artificial flowermaking, box making and nail making were carried out either in the home or in small dark & crowded workshops well out of the reach of the few factory inspectors. Although the trade unions were gaining popularity they were mostly run by men for men and had little to gain by fighting for the working conditions of women. Needless to say wages were very low and the hours very long. It was not uncommon for women who worked in these trades to resort to prostitution in order to top up their wages.

Another much hated "opening" for women was going into service where often the employers insisted upon changing their names and giving them a more "suitable"

one instead.


'A respectable girl, about 18 years of age as housemaid: tall and of good appearance: one who has not been out before preferred: must be willing and handy with her needle.'

For the middle class woman who desired a career the openings were fewer, clerical work in the new offices, typing and filing (but at a lower wage than men doing the same job), shop assistants, nurses, and elementary school teachers. A very few, mostly single women, had recently entered the medical profession, lectured at universities, and in a few cases had become factory inspectors. This small group of women were to play a very influential role in the emerging women's movement of the war years.

Before the war, the average wage of women in industrial work was eleven shillings (under 60 pence) per week, a third of the average male wage for the same job. However this was not a situation that many women tolerated without considerable protest. Most evident is the strike of the Cradley Heath chain workers in 1910, organised by Mary McArthur of the National Federation of Women Workers. The following year this outstanding woman organised strikes by jam and pickle workers, rag pickers, bottle washers and distillery workers. This general labour union did more to organise women in the workplace than any other body. The women marched in their Sunday-best, picketed and raised funds with much enthusiasm.

So remember girls there is no future without a past. Know where you come from, and know your history! § See next issue for episode 2. §



This "mock village" is said to resemble settlements on the North German plain, and is regarded


by the Army as an essential element in its NATO commitments.



YELLOW GATE GREENHAM COMMON

On the night of friday August II to Saturday August 12, five women from yellow gate tracked the exercising Cruise missile convoy to Imber Village (Salisbury Plain) which was stolen from the villagers in 1943. This action was also in memory and tribute to Helen Thomas, a Welsh woman killed by a police truck one week before." Helen openly made the connections between the Welsh and Irish nationalist struggles, through non-violent direct action. Four of the women were arrested after singing to attract the attention of the MOD and were charged with Tresspass. While two were released immediately on bail, the other two were held illegally at Salisbury police station, and subject to intimidation and mistreatment.

They were threatened with the Prevention of Terrorism Act; one was accused of being a member of the IRA, and the other told there was not a chance of her being released until after the 20th anniversary was over. The woman, who had a foreign accent was told: 'Why are you concerned about Cruise? You're not British.' She was also watched by a WPC while showering. This was designed to humiliate in the same way as strip searching women prisoners.

Both women had fulfilled their obligations under law by providing names and addresses, and neither has a record of failing to surrender to bail. Under the terms of the Bail Act (1976), they should have been released immediately on Bail with the other two women. Complaints are being submitted to the Wiltshire Constabulary.



She was taken to Whittington Hospital, north London, where the baby was stillborn. It is understood that the child was born prematurely.
