LADYFEST 2001 is a non-profit, community based cultural event to celebrate, showcase and encourage the artistic, organizational and political talents of women. Ladyfest is women-run but all are welcome and encouraged to attend.

Daytime performances will consist of workshops, panel discussions, films, art exhibitions and unsigned bands; evening performances, of headline bands, interspersed with spoken word/performance art and followed by afterhours clubs from Stiletto and the Strange Fruit Collective.

Tickets will cost £15 for a full one-day pass (reservations may need to be made for workshops) or may be purchased singly for individual events. Open to over-14 year olds only. Penny Arcade Monologist, ex-Warhol star and official anima of the late Quentin Crisp.

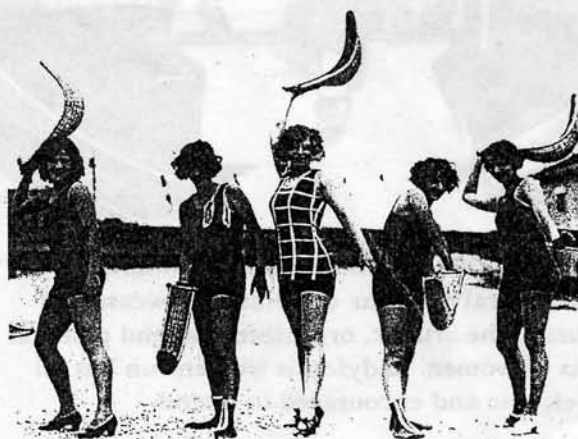
Pirate Jenny Fiction writer Jenny conducts workshop on self publishing.
